Begin your journey...

by exploring historical Halifax and scenic Peggy's Cove in Nova Scotia. Stop at Hopewell Cape the location of the highest tides in the world, view the Reversing Falls, visit St. Andrews by the Sea and experience Magnetic Hill in Moncton, New Brunswick. Cross Confederation Bridge to Prince Edward Island where you find miles of beaches and the best lobster dinners. Return to Nova Scotia by ferry and drive up the coast to Cape Breton Island. Travel the scenic Cabot Trail, visit the Alexander Graham Bell Museum and see the Fortress of Louisbourg before boarding the ferry to Newfoundland. Follow the Viking Trail to Gros Morne National Park, a World Heritage Site and a land of magnificent fjord-like lakes and grand vistas. Your journey continues across the heart of the island. Relive John Cabot's historic voyage and visit the Ryan Premises in Bonavista. Visit the Cable Provincial Historic Site at Heart's Content as you journey to the capital, St. John's.

DAY

- HOME CITIES to HALIFAX:** (2 nights) Your *Exciting Holiday* begins as you board your jet and fly to Halifax, the capital of Nova Scotia. Upon arrival transfer independently to your hotel where you have been pre-registered for two nights. A complimentary AIRPORT TRANSFER VOUCHER is provided. This evening features an informal WELCOME RECEPTION.
- HALIFAX:** This morning a GUIDED TOUR including the historic CITADEL, introduces you to Atlantic Canada's largest city. Later, enjoy an interesting visit to PIER 21 - Canada's Immigration Museum. Pier 21 was the entry point for 1.5 million immigrants, war brides, displaced people, evacuee children and Canadian military personnel from 1928-1971. The call of the ocean and the beauty of the sea will lure you to PEGGY'S COVE for a late afternoon visit and optional supper. With its lighthouse sitting on a massive granite ledge, this cove is known as a mecca for artists and photographers. Return to Halifax for overnight.
- HALIFAX to SAINT JOHN:** This morning enjoy a tour of the ANNE MURRAY MUSEUM in Springhill, Nova Scotia, hometown of Canada's famous "snowbird". Enter New Brunswick and stop at HOPEWELL CAPE, the location of the highest tides in the world. View the Flower Pot Rocks carved by the Fundy tides. These peculiar formations are forested islands at high tide and resemble flower pots at low tide. Travel through FUNDY NATIONAL PARK and arrive in Canada's Loyalist City, Saint John to view the REVERSING FALLS where the Bay of Fundy tides force the Saint John River to reverse direction.
- SAINT JOHN to FREDERICTON:** This morning visit ST. ANDREWS BY THE SEA, Canada's first seaside resort. Stroll through the historic streets and shop for handicrafts and woolens. Also view a number of homes steeped in the history of the area. Arrive in Fredericton for overnight.
- FREDERICTON to CHARLOTTETOWN:** (2 nights) Your morning drive through the rolling hills and dairy region of New Brunswick brings you to MAGNETIC HILL in Moncton where vehicles coast uphill, or seem to! Visit the fishing village of SHEDIAC for a photo opportunity with the WORLD'S LARGEST LOBSTER. Cross the Northumberland Strait arriving on Prince Edward Island via CONFEDERATION BRIDGE. This fixed crossing replaced the ferries which had been the main mode of transportation for almost a century. Tonight experience a true "island" tradition as our guests at a HOSTED LOBSTER DINNER (meal option available).
- CHARLOTTETOWN:** With a LOCAL GUIDE see the UNIQUE SIGHTS OF THE ISLAND including PROVINCE HOUSE, ANNE OF GREEN GABLES' house, CAVENDISH BEACH and Charlottetown. 2008 marked the 100th Anniversary of the publication of L.M. Montgomery's classic novel "Anne of Green Gables". This evening you may choose to enjoy an optional theatre performance. (The Anne of Green Gables performance is available during the summer months only)
- CHARLOTTETOWN to BADDECK:** (3 nights) Travel to Wood Islands to board the FERRY to Caribou on the Nova Scotia

mainland. Cross the Strait of Canso – the deepest causeway in the world. Continue to the resort town of Baddeck nestled on the shore of Bras d'Or Lake on Cape Breton Island for a three-night stay. Prior to arriving at your hotel, visit the ALEXANDER GRAHAM BELL MUSEUM to see the many exhibits of this famous inventor who spent much of his life on Cape Breton Island.



8 BADDECK: The spectacular scenery of Cape Breton Island unfolds during a circle tour of the CABOT TRAIL. Enjoy picture stops and a PICNIC LUNCH as you travel through CAPE BRETON HIGHLANDS NATIONAL PARK with its coastal mountain peaks, quaint seaports and rugged coastlines.

9 BADDECK: Step back in time to the year 1744 and experience the French FORTRESS OF LOUISBOURG This National Historic Site is one of the largest reconstructions in North America. This afternoon enjoy a visit

to Singer/Songwriter RITA MACNEIL'S TEA HOUSE AND CRAFT STORE at BigPond. Enjoy a DRIVING TOUR of Sydney on the way back to Baddeck for overnight.

10 BADDECK to FERRY to CORNER BROOK: Board the MARINE ATLANTIC FERRY at North Sydney for a six-hour crossing to Newfoundland. Dock at Port Aux Basques and continue to Corner Brook.

11 CORNER BROOK to GANDER: Travel north to GROS MORNE NATIONAL PARK, designated a World Heritage Site. Discover some of the world's most spectacular scenery. The steep cliffs, deep lakes and quaint fishing villages are a photographer's dream. Tour the park's DISCOVERY CENTRE overlooking spectacular Bonne Bay and enjoy an optional lunch in Woody Point. Continue to Gander to visit the SILENT WITNESS MEMORIAL and the AVIATION DISPLAY at the airport. During World War II, Gander became an important refueling stop for military aircraft crossing the Atlantic as well as a base for the coastal patrol.



12 GANDER to BONAVISTA to CLARENVILLE: Travel through TERRA NOVA NATIONAL PARK, the most easterly of Canada's national parks. Enjoy the beauty of the Discovery Trail to BONAVISTA, the site of John Cabot's historic landing in 1497. Visit the RYAN PREMISES and view the exhibits that commemorate the North Atlantic fishery and depict the history, landscape and culture of this restored 19th century town. Delight in the countless scenic coves and seascapes, before continuing to Clarenville. This evening you are treated to a SCREECH-IN CEREMONY, the traditional "Newfoundland Welcome".



13 CLARENVILLE to ST. JOHN'S: (2 nights) Continue on the Trans-Canada Highway and travel east to the Avalon Peninsula. Drive through Heart's Delight and Heart's Desire to the small town of Heart's Content. Visit the TRANS-ATLANTIC CABLE PROVINCIAL HISTORIC SITE, where the first transatlantic cable was landed in 1866. Then travel through the villages of Carbonear and Harbour Grace to St. John's, the provincial capital, for a two-night stay. Drive the Avalon Peninsula to CAPE SPEAR, home of the oldest lighthouse in the province and the most easterly point on the continent. From here you are closer to the British Isles than from anywhere else in North America.

14 ST. JOHN'S: This morning a GUIDED CITY TOUR will introduce you to one of the oldest European settlements in North America. The rest of the day is free to shop and sightsee on your own. This evening we invite you to a HOSTED FAREWELL DINNER, the perfect finale to a memorable touring adventure.

15 ST. JOHN'S to HOME: Your journey comes to an end. Arrival time at St. John's Airport is planned for 11:00 a.m. to allow for early afternoon flights.
